Lunch package at the venue (Mision de los Angeles):

If you wish you can buy a package of 4 light lunches (Salad, main dish, dessert, water and coffee) which will be served at the venue hotel gardens in coordination with the conference program, Sunday to Wednesday for \$ 41.60 usd.

This package will be sold in the front desk of Mision de los Angeles Hotel.

Note on dining: Mision de Los Angeles can seat 120 in the dining room, and another 40 on the adjacent outside veranda if it's not raining. Thus, the Special Package meal plans are available on a first-come basis to registrants.

Breakfasts may be obtained separately from the special package (if seating is available) by paying at the hotel.

Note for students on tight budgets: Students seeking to save money may choose to jam more than 3 people into a triple room. This will be tolerated provided they are quiet and exercise reasonable discretion (the hotel doesn't want to know about it). Alternatively, less expensive hotels exist nearby, but they are more variable in their comfort and security than those endorsed above.
